

FIRST READING: Micah 6:1-8

Hear what the LORD says:

Rise, plead your case before the mountains,
and let the hills hear your voice.

²Hear, you mountains, the case of the LORD,
and you enduring foundations of the earth,
for the LORD has a case against his people,
and he will contend with Israel.

³“O my people, what have I done to you?

In what have I wearied you? Answer me!

⁴For I brought you up from the land of Egypt
and redeemed you from the house of slavery,
and I sent before you Moses,
Aaron, and Miriam.

⁵O my people, remember now what

King Balak of Moab devised,

what Balaam son of Beor answered him,
and what happened from Shittim to Gilgal,
that you may know the saving acts of the LORD.”

⁶“With what shall I come before the LORD
and bow myself before God on high?

Shall I come before him with burnt offerings,
with calves a year old?

⁷Will the LORD be pleased with thousands of rams,
with ten thousands of rivers of oil?

Shall I give my firstborn for my transgression,
the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul?”

⁸He has told you, O mortal, what is good,
and what does the LORD require of you
but to do justice and to love kindness
and to walk humbly with your God?

Psalm 15**SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 1:18-31**

The message about the cross is foolishness to those
who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is
the power of God. ¹⁹For it is written,

“I will destroy the wisdom of the wise,
and the discernment of the discerning I will
thwart.”

²⁰Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scholar?
Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made
foolish the wisdom of the world? ²¹For since, in the
wisdom of God, the world did not know God through

wisdom, God decided, through the foolishness of the proclamation, to save those who believe. ²²For Jews ask for signs and Greeks desire wisdom, ²³but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to gentiles, ²⁴but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. ²⁵For God’s foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God’s weakness is stronger than human strength.

²⁶Consider your own call, brothers and sisters: not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. ²⁷But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; ²⁸God chose what is low and despised in the world, things that are not, to abolish things that are, ²⁹so that no one might boast in the presence of God. ³⁰In contrast, God is why you are in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification and redemption, ³¹in order that, as it is written, “Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord.”

GOSPEL: Matthew 5:1-12

When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain, and after he sat down, his disciples came to him. ²And he began to speak and taught them, saying:

³“Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

⁴“Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.

⁵“Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.

⁶“Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.


⁷“Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy.

**The Call Committee and Council are excited to announce that we have approved
recommending a pastoral candidate to our congregation!**

What does this mean?

The call committee met with the candidate and proceeded to recommend him to the council. The council met and interviewed him on January 22nd and voted unanimously that evening to recommend him to the congregation as Immanuel's next pastor.

What's next?

There will be a Meet & Greet on Sunday, February 1st at 4PM at the church. We will gather in the sanctuary for an introduction and short presentation then will move to the parish hall for refreshments and time for members to personally meet with the candidate and his wife.

At the regularly scheduled council meeting on Tuesday, February 10th at 7PM, the council will discuss and approve a proposed compensation plan for the candidate that will be presented at the annual meeting.

At our Annual Meeting on February 15th at 10AM, we will hold a congregational vote on whether or not to proceed with this candidate and the approved compensation plan. Bishop Greg Busboom will be in attendance at this meeting to answer questions, help with the ballots, and if the candidate is approved will have paperwork ready for us to complete the process of the call.

We hope you can all join us as we take these next steps in deciding the future of Immanuel Lutheran Church. The call committee and council members are grateful for the patience the congregation has had as we have navigated the call process for the last 5 years and waited for a candidate that we believe is a good fit for our congregation.
